The College encompasses a main campus (PCOM) in Philadelphia; a branch campus (PCOM Georgia) in Suwanee, Georgia; and an additional location (PCOM South Georgia) in Moultrie, Georgia. PCOM manages several urban Healthcare Centers/clinical teaching sites in Philadelphia. Research continues to grow as a priority at the College; a Division of Research assists with all functional areas across locations, and a Center for the Study of Chronic Diseases of Aging enables interdisciplinary research, education and clinical application.
