Dear Preceptor,

In our continuing effort to improve the educational process for our students and meet the development needs of our preceptors, we have prepared 5 new preceptor development modules to add to the 5 existing ones. If you have not completed any of these offerings, we suggest that you start with Module 1 and work through the entire group. Preceptors who have already completed modules 1 through 5 may want to begin with module 6. There have been some revisions in the first 5 (especially module 5 –Assessment and Evaluation). If it's been a while since you completed these, you may want to go over them again. Since these modules have been revised, you may claim the CE again. The amount of CE provided by the modules has also been revised to meet current ACPE standards.

These programs are intended to help you as you seek to improve your skills as a preceptor and are offered free of charge to preceptors of the following institutions: Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy, Samford University McWhorter School of Pharmacy, Mercer University College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences, South University School of Pharmacy, Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine School of Pharmacy and The University of Georgia College of Pharmacy.
