PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The 26th Annual Family Weekend CME program is targeted to the needs of the osteopathic family physician and other primary care health providers.

Upon completion of the program, the participant should be able to:

- Discuss factors and possible solutions to the maternal mortality rate in the U.S.
- Define strategies for implementing quality preventive services using the revised Bright Futures: Guidelines for Health Supervision of Infants, Children, and Adolescents and related Periodicity Schedule.
- Identify opportunities to tailor and apply AAP recommendations with available tools and resources to successfully implement of Bright Futures recommendations into practice.
- Recognize the new 2018 WHO guidelines and priorities in the treatment of multi-drug resistant tuberculosis.
- Identify the rationale for mental health screening in primary care and describe how screening may influence treatment outcome and patient adherence.
- Discuss who and how to test and treat influenza.
- Define practical uses of pre-and post-exposure prophylaxis for influenza.
- Understand the basic structure and function of the various types of antibodies currently utilized as therapeutics.
- Understand the current applications of monoclonal therapeutics and the potential applications of monoclonal antibodies in the future in combination with/ in place of current therapeutics (the standard of care).
- Recognize some of the common cutaneous manifestations of infectious disease.
- Review the Multiple Psychiatric and medical comorbidities and Complementary Integrative Treatments.
- Understand the concept of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV prevention.
- Review data on pivotal studies on the use of PrEP for HIV prevention.
- Define and list the subtypes of IBS.
- Describe the "typical" IBS patient profile and discuss the various treatment options for IBS.
- Identify three vaccine challenges faced in the U.S. today and summarize several significant vaccine successes.
- Recognize the limitations of diagnosing pneumonia in the pediatric patient.

- Understand appropriate antibiotic choices in pediatric patients with community acquired pneumonia.
- Learn about the varied approaches to pediatric care using integrative health techniques.
- Describe how physicians and health care entities can build greater trust in their patients and communities.
- Review recent evidence affecting the diagnosis and management of those with Chronic Kidney Disease and elevated blood pressure.
- Discuss the therapeutics of various agents used in managing patients with uncontrolled hypertension.
- Recognize the importance of screening for anal cancer in appropriate patient populations and review the technique for performing the anal Pap.
- Discuss the role of Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) in cervical carcinogenesis and of HPV testing.
