We work with students, faculty, staff, alumni and external stakeholders to address community health priorities, expand clinical training opportunities, and develop stronger partnerships with local organizations.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND PARTNERSHIPS

CAMPUSWIDE

Expanded PCOM's pathway and community engagement impact through innovative programming and strategic partnerships. In collaboration with the Tiger Woods Foundation, CCP launched the Greens to Goals: Healthcare Careers Exploration Series—featuring Careers in Psychology and Counseling, Cardiology, Primary Care Careers, and an interactive Forensics Escape Room—to deepen early exposure to healthcare professions for 50+ students during fall 2025.

Community-based Research: Faculty innovation supported across campuses through funding three competitive community-based research fellowship awards.

COMMUNITY AND ACADEMIC PARTNERSHIPS

PCOM Opportunities Academy is a summer enrichment program that introduces students to opportunities in health care, college readiness and mentoring. The program is led by the Office of Campus and Community Partnerships, faculty coordinators, and PCOM student mentors.

In 2025, PCOM hosted:

Thomasville City Schools


- + **55** youth supported through Athletes in Medicine, COMPASS, and wellness workshops
