PROGRAM BASICS

PCOM's 60-credit MS in Mental Health Counseling program prepares students to provide evidence-based, culturally sensitive and collaborative treatment in a variety of settings.

Our core curriculum covers ethics, clinical assessment, counseling skills, research methods, as well as social and cultural foundations shown to impact well-being. Throughout the program our students build on their foundational skills and knowledge through a variety of courses, such as human sexuality, trauama, and other evidenced-based interventions. Students can also focus on marriage and family therapy, cognitive behavioral therapy or addictions and correctional counseling.

Our main campus is located on the outskirts of Philadelphia and features a gym, a cafeteria, meditation spaces, a digital library, computer labs and more.
