OBJECTIVE

Upon completion of this program, participants will acquire an updated understanding of current diagnosis, intervention and treatment of medical circumstances arising from traumatic disorders including brain, abdominal, and occult injuries, trauma in pregnancy and pediatrics and child abuse, tick borne disease, skin and soft tissue infections, near drowning, neurologic emergencies and street drug pharmacology. In addition, ED management of STEMI, cardiac dysrhythmias, opioid prescribing and abuse, the agitated patient, adolescent OB/Gyn, early pregnancy complications, eclampsia and critical care documentation will be presented. Additional presentations will include risk management topics related to ALTO program, physician burnout, decision making pitfalls, patient safety, the aging emergency physician, politics and medicine, electronic trigger tool to improve sepsis management and challenging cases from current emergency medicine practice.
