LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this program, participants will acquire an updated understanding of current diagnosis, intervention and treatment of medical circumstances arising from pediatric, dermatologic, neurologic, orthopedic and abdominal disorders including pediatric chest, pediatric hematology/oncology, congenital heart disease, dermatologic emergencies and rashes, pelvic fractures, dislocation, reductions, misadventures, subtle manifestations of neurologic disease, hemorrhagic stroke, and stroke in women and young adults. Additionally, ED management of gastrointestinal presentations including abdominal pain in the elderly, mesenteric ischemia, THC, Havana Syndrome, ED physician impact on patients with substance abuse disorder, and doctor patient relationship will be discussed. Washington DC update, medical-legal issues for physicians, EMTALA, compliance issues, community paramedicine and use of office based and urgent care providers for decompressing mass casualty will be presented. Ethics and morals of regional contingency vs crisis standards in the ED, atypical and challenging ED presentations, and cases from current emergency medicine practice will be included.
